### Floridians Should Keep in Touch with FEMA

**TALLAHASSEE, Fla.** – Although the deadline to apply for FEMA assistance for Hurricanes Milton and/or Helene has passed, we are still available to help applicants. Floridians affected by the storms should stay in touch with FEMA to ensure their disaster assistance process stays on track.

It is especially important to let FEMA know about any changes to your contact information. You may update contact information or check on the status of your application by:
